UPDATED COVID RESOURCES

Our COVID OR and PPE protocols have been updated and added to the COVID intranet, our department website and EPIC dashboard. Please take the time to read them if you work at a location that takes care of COVID patients in the OR/NORA sites. We also wanted to highlight the recovery process for COVID+ cases. Ideally, the cases would go to PACU, but we have on occasion recovered them in the OR and then transported them back to their hospital room. If the patient is not returning to an ICU, they need to be recovered in the OR for 30-45 minutes at least or until stable before going to a non ICU bed. The stepdown area and floors have a 1:4 to 1:5 RN to patient ratio. If there is any question of whether the patient is ready for the floor, reach out to the accepting RN to discuss.

MUSC COVID-19 OR Case Protocol

The following is a description of how the suspected or positive COVID-19 patient will be cared for in the operating rooms (OR) at MUSC Main, MUSC Children's and MUSC ART.

See <u>MUSC ANESTHESIA AND SURGERY PPE POLICY 1-4-22</u> for details on PPE selection by case characteristics.

	Necessary OP/AM
Screen patlents	Ask if the patient or the individual that will be accompanying them have any of the following symptoms: Fever Cough Shortness of breath Runny nose Myalgias Sore threat Nausea/vomiting Diarrhea Loss of smell/taste If the patient is symptomatic: 1) Notify the surgery team and the OR (DOD or charge nurse) 2) Surgery or procedure should be delayed 21 days from onset of symptoms or date of positive COVID test (whichever came first) whenever possible 3) If delay of a surgery or precedure >21 days will significantly, negatively impact care, the case will proceed as follows: • 0-10 days since onset of symptoms or positive COVID test (whichever occurred first), staff must wear full PPE per current guidelines • Note that during the 10-21 day period, risk to the patient of adverse outcomes are increased
	Infectious outpatients presenting for surgery or procedure should be escorted into the hospital (masked) and taken directly to an isolation room whenever possible. Every effort should be made to minimize exposure to other patients and care team members

 "Fully immunized" = received all doses (two doses if 2-dose series (Pfizer, Moderna); one dose if 1-dose series (Johnson & Johnson)), and, if eligible (i.e., ≥ 5 months after initial vaccination series), a booster. In all cases, a patient is "fully immunized" two weeks after receiving the final immunization.
