Introduction: Importance of research topic. An introductory statement (thesis) explaining the reason for the research, or a statement of the problem. The final sentence of the introduction describes the purpose of the research or the priori hypothesis.

Methods: What approaches were used? Describe how you went about solving the problem or exploring the issue identified in the introduction.

Results: What did you find? This section should list the results or outcomes of the work you have done so far.

Conclusion: What did you learn? Give a brief statement of the project's implications and contributions to its field.

Type of Project: (clinical or basic science, epidemiology, etc...)

ABSTRACT GUIDELINES:

- Abstract Length: Approximately 300 words. No more than 1 page
- Must be submitted as a Word Document. Please make sure it is the final version (no track changes showing)
- Title, Participants Name, Division and Department of Medicine Affiliations must be included on the Abstract
- Abstract is clearly organized into Introduction, Methods, Results, and Conclusion
- Font/Style should be Arial 11
- Graphs and photos are allowed, as long as it remains 1 page.

All Abstracts will be accepted for poster presentations and included in our Research Day booklet. A copy of the booklet will be given to each presenter and the judges the day of the event. Poster presentations will begin at 9:00 AM on April 26 on the 9th Floor of the Clinical Sciences Building. Each presenter will have 10 minutes to present their work to the judges.
