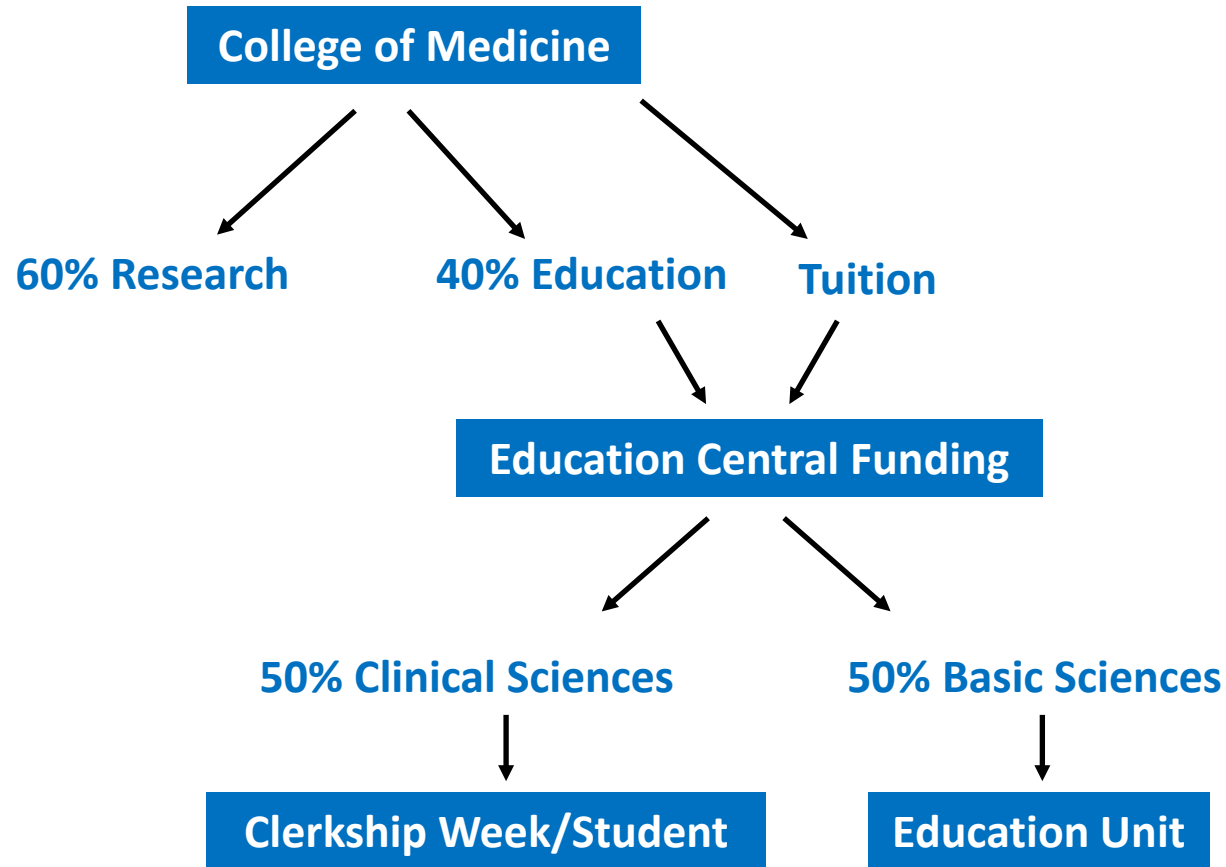

Research

-Core research curriculum + scholarly project requirement.
-Funded, mentored research in field of interest.
(Optional) Students may seek a **Master of Science in Clinical Research** degree.

Humanities

-Core medical humanities curriculum + scholarly project requirement.
-Supported with resources from the new MUSC Office of Humanities.

Medical Education

-Core medical education curriculum + scholarly project requirement.
-Students inducted into COM Academy for Medical Educators as teaching fellows.

Global Health

-Core global and public health curriculum + scholarly project requirement.
(Optional) Students may seek a Master of Public Health degree.
