Above is an example block diagram of our PGY1 curriculum. Below are further details on each rotation:

Adult Inpatient: We have two inpatient teams, each led by a PGY2 or PGY3 Family Medicine resident alongside a Family Medicine attending. Each team includes two interns covering the day shift. Interns have one afternoon of continuity clinic per week. Teams cap at 16 patients, with each intern caring for up to 8 patients. A night float team consisting of one upper-level resident and one intern provides night coverage. Day shift runs from 6:30am to 5:00pm, with one resident staying until 8pm. Night shift runs from 8:00pm to 10:00am, as residents are expected to present the overnight admissions on rounds the following morning. All residents are scheduled for an average of one day off per week over the course of the rotation.

Adult ER: Residents rotate at either our main hospital or the Ashley River Tower. They work alongside residents from Emergency Medicine, Anesthesia, Internal Medicine, Neurology, and Psychiatry, with supervision by Emergency Medicine faculty. Residents typically work 3–4 shifts per week, each lasting 8–9 hours, and continue to attend one half-day of continuity clinic per week.

OB L&D: Residents spend three days per week on the L&D floor, working alongside OB residents under the supervision of OB faculty. They also spend one morning per week in the outpatient OB clinic with our Family Medicine–OB faculty, and two half-days per week in continuity clinic. Residents have Saturday and Sundays off during this rotation.

Nursery: Residents spend three of the five weeks in the Level I newborn nursery, working alongside pediatric residents under the supervision of pediatric faculty. During this time, they attend one half-day of continuity clinic per week. The remaining two weeks of the block are spent in outpatient clinic, divided between continuity clinic and faculty practice. During the nursery portion of the rotation, residents will be scheduled for one day off per week. During the outpatient portion of the rotation, residents will have Saturdays and Sundays off.

OB Outpt: Residents spend 1.5 days per week in an outpatient practice with a nurse midwife and one half-day per week in continuity clinic. The remaining three days are spent on the inpatient postpartum service, working alongside OB residents under the supervision of OB faculty. Residents will have Sundays and Mondays off during this rotation.
