Keynote Speaker

Eben L. Rosenthal, M.D.

is a surgeon-scientist who serves as the John and Ann Doerr Medical Director of the Stanford Cancer Center. He works collaboratively with the Stanford Cancer Institute and Stanford Health Care

leaders to set the strategy for the clinical delivery of cancer care across Stanford Medicine and growing cancer networks. He is a Professor of Otolaryngology and Radiology (courtesy) and a member of Molecular Imaging Program at Stanford (MIPS). He continues to be clinically active as an oncologic and microvascular reconstructive surgeon.

Dr. Rosenthal conducts early phase clinical trials for diagnostic and therapeutic agents for the treatment of solid tumors. He is part of a multidisciplinary team of clinicians and basic scientists that perform preclinical studies, nonhuman primate IND-enabling studies, and first-in-human clinical trials. The team assesses near infrared fluorescent contrast agents for use in the operating room to make the cancer visible. Ongoing clinical trials include brain, lung, pancreas, skin and head and neck tumors. The lab also focuses on molecular imaging of fluorescently labeled therapeutic antibodies to measure cellular delivery of therapies to tumors and adjacent tissues.

Dr. Rosenthal grew up in Ann Arbor, Michigan and went to Haverford College for his undergraduate education.

Born in Maryland,
Dr. F. Johnson Putney was a graduate of Furman University. He attended medical school at Jefferson Medical College, where he also completed



pathology and medical/surgical internships. While serving a preceptorship with Dr. Louis H. Clerf, he also studied anatomy at Harvard Medical School. He finished residency at Manhattan Eye, Ear and Throat hospital and continued there as a faculty developing his specialty in head and neck surgery and was a diplomate of the American Board of Otolaryngology.

Dr. Putney served in the United States Army in World War II and received the Meritorious Service Award. After the war, he taught and practiced at Thomas Jefferson Medical College and other Philadelphia hospitals. Fortunately for Charleston and MUSC, he joined the faculty in the Department of Otolaryngology in 1967 as Professor of Otolaryngology.

A founding member and first treasurer of the American Society for Head and Neck Surgery, Dr. Putney also served as President of the American Broncho-Esophagological Association, the American Laryngological Association and the South Carolina Otolaryngology Society. He has held offices in numerous other societies, including the American College of Surgeons, and is well known for his editorial abilities. The author of more than 100 articles and book chapters, he has been Guest of Honor of the ABEA and the ALA. Dr. Putney is a recipient of The Newcomb Award and was elected an Honorary Fellow of the American Society for Head and Neck Surgery in 1996. Dr. Putney died December 2004. He is survived by three sons, a daughter and five grandchildren.
