Dr. Carole Fakhry is a head and neck surgical oncologist at Johns Hopkins.

After an undergraduate degree at Stanford University, she completed medical school, residency in otolaryngology head and neck surgery and fellowship in head and neck surgical oncology at Johns Hopkins.

She has also received a master's in public health from the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health. She is presently professor in the Johns Hopkins Department of Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery, Oncology and Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health Department of Epidemiology.

Her research interest focuses on the role of human papillomavirus (HPV) in head and neck squamous cell cancer. She has demonstrated that the presence of HPV confers a prognostic advantage to individuals with oropharyngeal cancer and that HPV is associated with unique clinical characteristics. In addition to the clinical implications of HPV in head and neck cancer, she is coprincipal investigator of a large study to understand screening individuals at "high-risk" of malignancy and evaluating imaging modalities to improve diagnostics and early detection of HPV- related head and neck cancer.

She is Executive Vice Director of the Department of Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery, Chief of Division of Head and Neck Surgery, Director of the Head and Neck Cancer Center. She also serves as director of the head and neck group in the Bloomberg~Kimmel Institute for Cancer Immunotherapy and the head and neck surgical oncology fellowship. She is associate editor for Oral Oncology and serves on several editorial boards.

Born in Maryland, **Dr. F. Johnson Putney** was a graduate of Furman University. He attended medical school at Jefferson Medical College, where he also completed pathology and medical/surgical internships. While serving a preceptorship with Dr. Louis H. Clerf, he also studied anatomy at Harvard Medical School. He finished residency at Manhattan Eye, Ear and Throat hospital and continued there as a faculty developing his specialty in head and neck surgery and was a diplomate of the American Board of Otolaryngology.

Dr. Putney served in the United States Army in World War II and received the Meritorious Service Award. After the war, he taught and practiced at Thomas Jefferson Medical College and other Philadelphia hospitals. Fortunately for Charleston and MUSC, he joined the faculty in the Department of Otolaryngology in 1967 as Professor of Otolaryngology.



A founding member and first treasurer of the American Society for Head and Neck Surgery, Dr. Putney also served as President of the American Broncho-Esophagological Association, the American Laryngological Association and the South Carolina Otolaryngology Society. He has held offices in numerous other societies, including the American College of Surgeons, and is well known for his editorial abilities. The author of more than 100 articles and book chapters, he has been Guest of Honor of the ABEA and the ALA. Dr. Putney is a recipient of The Newcomb Award and was elected an Honorary Fellow of the American Society for Head and Neck Surgery in 1996. Dr. Putney died December 2004. He is survived by three sons, a daughter and five grandchildren.
