CURRENT TRAINEES

The FLEX Research Elective is a 13-week training open to College of Medicine Students at MUSC.



Jelissa Suarez is a second year medical student at MUSC. She completed her undergraduate education at the University of South Carolina Honors College and has experience in medical interpretation, public health work with migrant farm workers, and international missions. Jelissa will be mentored by Tom Uhde, M.D. during her FLEX Elective with the DART Program, investigating sleep inertia among medical personnel. This project will consist of 4 primary phases: developing a sleep inertia questionnaire (SIQ) for medical personnel, administering the SIQ, determining whether the SIQ predicts objective findings of cognitive and motor performance impairment under controlled conditions, and finally, determining the impact of sleep deprivation on performance with and without sleep inertia.

2020 DART Summer Fellow


Mentored by Amber Jarnecke, Ph.D.

Zahraa Atoui, M.D. graduated medical school from the American University of Beirut, Lebanon. During her DART Summer Training, Zahraa worked with Dr. Amber Jarnecke to explore the neural reactivity in response to trauma and alcohol cues in patients with comorbid alcohol use disorder (AUD) and post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD), using functional MRI. She is currently working on a manuscript from the results. Zahraa continued to collaborate with her mentor on another fMRI project, the CIRCUITS Study,



which examines brain activation and behavioral responses to in-scanner tasks, in comorbid AUD and PTSD. Zahraa recently matched into her first choice for residency, where she will be starting her psychiatry training at MUSC in July.

Loan Repayment Program (LRP)

The Clinical Research Loan Repayment Program is a vital component of our nation's efforts to attract health professionals to careers in clinical research. In exchange for a two-year commitment to clinical research, NIH will repay up to \$35,000 per year of qualified educational debt, pay an additional 39% of the repayments to cover Federal taxes, and may reimburse state taxes that result from these payments. To participate, you must conduct clinical research for 50% or more of your total effort (average at least 20 hours per week) during each quarterly service period. Examples of DART alumni who completed the LRP are Drs. Kelly Barth, Bryan Tolliver, Jennifer Jones, & Joshua Brown.
