A Visit with Vascular & Interventional Radiology

Greetings to MUSC Radiology Alumni!

As the Division Director of Vascular and Interventional Radiology (VIR), I would like to share with you some of the developments that our division has undergone in practice, geography, equipment and staffing over the last few years.

The VIR Division is growing in many ways! Over the last years, the number of faculty has grown from 5 to 8. Although we have recently lost three faculty, Andre Uflacker, Varshana Gurusamy and Thor Johnson, we have since gained three full time faculty, as well as two part time faculty.



Tony Gayed and Stephen Stringfellow, our most recent graduates of the IR integrated residency (and representing the first class of this residency program), have joined the faculty this summer. Yara Younan will be joining us this fall as well. John Aruny is on the part time faculty, having joined us this Spring, and Tom Scagnelli will be joining us this Fall. In addition, Cane Hoffman has joined us and leads our Lancaster Division for VIR. We have gained members of our APP staff as well. We now total 6 APPs and have expanded their scope of practice. We are about to hire our seventh APP for our growing outpatient clinic demands.

Our clinical practice continues to grow and diversify, with the additions of many new procedures and therapies.

Our Pediatric VIR practice is also developing. Under Ricardo Yamada's guidance, the practice has grown, despite not having a dedicated procedure room at the Shawn Jenkins Children's Hospital. This summer, we welcomed Lisa Betz, MD from Cincinatti Children's Hospital onto the faculty of Pediatric and Interventional Radiology. We fortunately have a dedicated VIR room in the works as well.

Our IR residency program continues to thrive, attracting excellent candidates and performing very well in the match. Under the leadership of Ricardo Yamada and the new Associate Program Director Tony Gayed, the well-rounded and busy training experience at MUSC continues to produce VIR physicians that are very well-trained and sought-after by academic and private practices in all areas of the US.

The VIR Division is also updating and growing in its physical plant. The Main hospital's Room 2 is currently being replaced with the new Siemens Pheno IR angio system, which is a robotic system and as such is very different and more versatile than traditional angio systems. Room 1 will be replaced within the next year. The Room 3 CT unit was replaced several months ago and is a state of the art procedural CT scanner. In the Ashley River Tower, third floor, the procedural CT will be replaced presently, followed by room 2 angio suite replacement soon after.

In November 2023, the new VIR practice at the West Ashley site will open. This will provide an opportunity for purely outpatient VIR procedures to be performed, as well as new clinic space.


As you see, the VIR division at MUSC is flourishing and continues to evolve and grow.




