What's Going on at MUSC Radiology

A Visit with Women's Imaging

As the Division Director of Breast Imaging at MUSC, I would like to share with you the exciting developments that have occurred in MUSC Charleston Breast Imaging over the years.

The Breast Imaging division at MUSC has grown significantly. We developed a strategic mission with the goal of providing high quality patient centered breast imaging care throughout the community where patients work and live. We recognized our need to improve accessibility for all patients needing breast imaging care, our need to continue to address healthcare disparities in our state, continue to collaborate with the mission of the Hollings Cancer Center (our states only NCI designated Cancer Center) and support our MUSC breast surgery and oncology team.



We are also proud of our strong culture of collaboration with our breast imaging staff and technologists with a dedicated focus on image quality and high level patient care. The academic mission of supporting medical student, resident and fellow breast imaging education and breast imaging research remains at the forefront of our passion for academic radiology.

Our growth initiatives include expansion, providing full breast imaging services at our new MUSC Health West Ashley Site, growth of breast imaging services at the MUSC Health East Mount Pleasant site and our Hollings Cancer Center, and continued success at our breast cancer screening site at MUSC North Charleston. Our mobile mammography van is newly replaced, offering digital breast tomosynthesis and extending out into the community to help underserved patients. We offer tomosynthesis at all sites and have introduced new procedure technologies with our non-wire localization procedures.

While we have been excited about our growth opportunities, we were sad to see Dr. Susan Ackerman and Dr. Dag Pavic retire recently. After many years of dedicated service,

Dr. Abid Irshad stepped down as the director in 2020 but continues to offer his coveted radiology expertise with breast and ultrasound imaging as well as research. Dr. Madelene Lewis, one of our breast and ultrasound radiologists and past residency program director, became the Vice Chair of Clinical Operations with Dr. Ackerman's retirement and the blessing of our new chairman.

Fortunately, we have been able to successfully recruit fellowship trained breast imagers including some of our own past residents or fellows. Dr. Leonel Vasquez, Dr. Brielle Paolini, Dr. Ian Smith, and Dr. Frank Vento have all joined our practice these past few years. Dr. Courtney Stewart, also a past resident, will return to MUSC and join our breast imaging faculty in spring 2024. Dr. Brittany Dobson, one of our recent fellowship graduates, has taken over as the lead interpreting physician for breast imaging at the newly acquired MUSC Orangeburg Hospital, and we will continue to provide collaboration for her in that role. Dr. Abbie Cluver now leads our medical student 4th year breast imaging course.

Our breast fellowship has also expanded to three positions, and I have continued to support this as fellowship director. We have seen a renewed interest in MUSC residents going into breast imaging fellowships which has been exciting for our team to support.

Our breast imaging team continues to maintain a positive culture focusing on a collaborative and team-based environment. We are intent on providing the best care and support for our patients, colleagues, trainees, staff, and each other.

We always love to hear from our past alumni and hope that everyone is doing well.

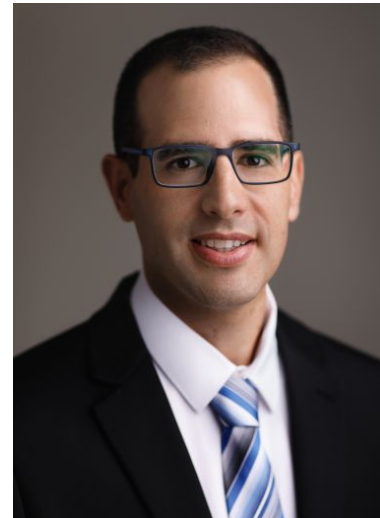

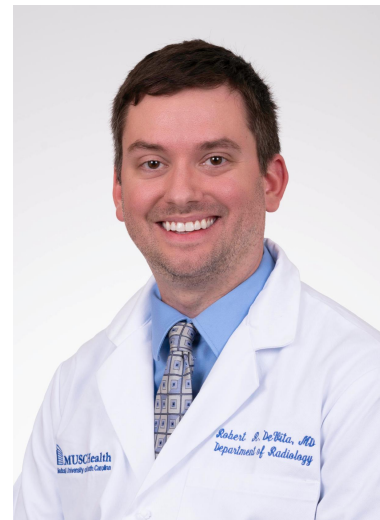


New Faculty at MUSC Radiology
