#### PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Nontuberculous mycobacterial (NTM) infections are increasingly recognized but management decisions are complex. This conference will review risk factors and presenting features of patients with NTM infections, current practices for their diagnosis and management, and novel areas of research. A comprehensive approach to the evaluation and management of NTM infections will be reviewed including antibiotics and their monitoring, non-pharmacologic therapy, and psychosocial aspects of disease and treatment. Topics will also include how to advocate for the patient, how to work with an NTM center in co-management of a patient, and ongoing development of novel therapies. The program is designed for primary care, pulmonary, and infectious disease clinicians.
