Learning Objectives: Identify characteristic clinical features and develop a differential diagnosis for knee pain in pediatric patients, considering other musculoskeletal conditions, traumatic injuries, and systemic disorders; Discuss the appropriate diagnostic evaluation for patellofemoral pain syndrome, including history-taking, physical examination techniques, and imaging modalities (e.g., X-ray, MRI) to aid in accurate diagnosis and management decisions; Discuss the evidence-based management of patellofemoral pain syndrome in pediatric patients and young athletes, including preventative strategies, physical therapy, medications and surgical indications, and gradual progression of activities; Identify history and exam findings that raise suspicion for meniscal injuries including developing a differential diagnosis for knee pain with effusion in a pediatric patient; Discuss the appropriate diagnostic evaluation and treatment options (conservative and surgical) for meniscal injuries.; Discuss risk factors that predispose pediatric patients to meniscal injuries; Discuss how to deal with growth plate related issues in the skeletally immature patient with regards to ACL tear and reconstruction.



## Access to Recorded Presentations


